Today the Tuesday Morning Men's Bible Study began a study of Ephesians with "yours truly" leading the first lesson. The theme of Ephesians is our riches in Christ and the key verse of the book is Ephesians 1:3: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places. The word riches occurs in the opening three chapters five times: the riches of his grace, 1:7; the riches of his glorious inheritance, 1:18; the immeasurable riches of his grace, 2:7; the unsearchable riches of Christ, 3:8; the riches of his glory, 3:16. No wonder Pastor Warren Wiersbe entitled his volume on Ephesians, Be Rich.

Ministry & Mission Moment Requests

When we look at the plan of Ephesians, it is telling us how the Christian life is to be lived. Ancient Ephesus was a center of pagan religious worship with the Temple of Diana located there as one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. The occult and magic arts were practiced in the city as a way to ward off the spirit world. So Ephesus was a mixture of false gods, pagan practices and superstition all done in an attempt to curry favor with the gods and combat evil spirits. Early Ephesian believers were tempted to mix some of these approaches into their faith in Jesus Christ. Ephesians sets them straight that the Christian life must be lived a different way.

Easter Sunday Schedule

Watchman Nee, the Chinese evangelist, gave a simple outline of Ephesians that sets out in succinct terms Paul's view of how to live the Christian life. Chapters 1-3 = <u>Sit</u>. We are *seated* ... in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus. Christ has given us all the heavenly resources we need for spiritual living here and now. Our first need is that God...may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him...that you may know...what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, 1:17-19. We need to sit and learn our spiritual blessings in Christ and their sufficiency for Christian living. Commenting on this, Pastor Erwin Lutzer writes:

Spring Hymn Sing

Let me put it this way: when we accept Christ as Savior, God immediately gives us special recognition, status, authority, power and a host of spiritual privileges. If we are ignorant of these, we will dutifully plod thru life quite certain that Christianity isn't all that it is supposed to be. We will be powerless to achieve spiritual victory when sin rears its ugly head, and there will be no love, joy and peace thru the hardships of life. (*You're Richer Than You Think*, p. 8-9).

Chapters 4-5 = Walk. Walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called. Here we discover that a new status as children of God with commensurate spiritual resources, demands a new way of life, a new walk. As we discern what is pleasing to the Lord, we can walk, not as unwise but as wise, 5:10, 15. We can do this by drawing upon the power of the Holy Spirit as we are filled with the Spirit, 5:18. We have to walk, but we are not walking alone. We are enlightened and empowered by Him who indwells us.

Chapter $6 = \underline{\textbf{Stand}}$. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. Spiritual warfare is won by knowing our resources, applying them, and standing when Satan attacks. We have all that we need for the battle. We are a well-equipped army. Sit, walk and stand. That's how the Christian life works.

From the Family Life Pastor:

Thoughts:

Last week our pastors who are in the Evangelical Pastors Prayer Fellowship (EPPF) were planning our Good Friday celebration which we do as a group of teachers every year. It just brought to my mind the celebration of such an amazing and wonderful Christian season.

As I think of Easter, my first thought goes to John 3:16 – "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life". I know that we all know that verse, most have it memorized, and hopefully we think about it often. You might wonder, when thinking about Easter, why would you start with this verse – simply this – if it weren't for God's amazing love for us in that while we were yet sinners – enemies of God, God loved us enough to send His "only Son" with a purpose – "That whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life". Christ's whole mission in coming to the earth from heaven was to being eternal life to "believers".

It is worth noting that the "for" in verse 16 connects with the previous verse – verse 15 says "that whoever believes in Him ma have eternal life". God in His Word is giving us hope and promise.

Jesus emphasizes that thought in John 14 – Jesus is instructing His disciples about while lies ahead for Him, and He tells them that He is going to prepare a place for them (believers), and Thomas who sees things in black and white and needs to be told specifically what Jesus means, and then in verse 6 Jesus says: "I am the way, and the truth and the life no one comes to the Father except through me". As I read these verses, it seems very clear to me that God loved me and you enough that He sent His one and only Son into the world, and any and all who believe in Him will have eternal life – and only those who believe in Jesus Christ will have that promise.

This point is reinforced in 1 John 5:11-13 – "And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life". I love that God doesn't keep it as some vague process or hope that maybe some day you might have – He says that you may know that you have eternal life "if you believe in the Son of God".

Jesus promised that if He goes – dies and goes to heaven – John 14:3 – "And if I go and prepare a place for you (in His Father's house) I will come again and will

take you to myself, that where I am you may be also". The "if" here is not a question mark, but rather a point of assurance – I am going and I will come back!

So, what does this all have to do with Easter? Jesus or anyone else could have made all kinds of promises and statements about things, but only through God's work could someone truly make that promise and then have the ability to carry it out. This is not a "hope, maybe", it is a "I will"!

The Bible tells us that Jesus was killed upon a cross on what we celebrate as Good Friday. It is the day that we recognize – with a certain solemnity that Jesus Christ – the one that God had sent to bring eternal life died upon that cross next to two thieves. There is no question that he died, he was taken down by Joseph of Arimathea, and Nicodemus who had come to Jesus in the night to ask about salvation in John 3 (which is where this all started) and Jesus makes it very clear to him. Now, Nicodemus is publicly helping to take Jesus' body down from the cross and bury it. Jesus was dead, he was buried!

But!!! Praise His Holy Name!!! God raised Jesus back to life again, and according to the scriptures, He was seen over a period of forty days by hundreds of people who saw that he was alive, he walked with them, talked with them, ate with them, touched them, was touched by them, proving that He is alive.

Then in Acts 1:6-11 – "Jesus was taken up into heaven". ALIVE!!! Praise the Lord – He is alive and so all of the promises are ours – He has made the way! HAPPY EASTER!

Breakfast Casserole

1.5 lbs sausage
9 eggs beaten
3 c. milk
1.5 tsp dry mustard
1 tsp. salt
4 slices of bread
(cut in cubes)
1.5 c grated cheddar

Brown sausage and drain grease. Mix all other ingredients and add to sausage. Mix well. Pour in greased 9x13 pan. Refrigerate overnight, covered. Bake uncovered for 1 hour at 350°. Cut into squares.

Variation Option: ham, bacon, bear, elk or make it vegetarian by using mushrooms, broccoli, spinach, red or yellow pepper or a combination of everything is good too.
