THE LAW OF THE PENDULUM

What is saving Faith? Is it a mere intellectual ascent to a set of facts? Is it signing on to a creed or a doctrinal statement? Or is it something more? Surely we are saved by faith and not by works (Ephesians 2:8-9). But the scripture also says that we must believe in our hearts (Romans 10:9). So it is clearly more than intellectual ascent, a heart attitude is required. In my next few articles I am going to explore what saving faith really is. I am going to begin with a story from author Ken Davis. He writes,

In college I was asked to prepare a lesson to teach my speech class. We were to be graded on our creativity and ability to drive home a point in a memorable way. The title of my talk was, "The Law of the Pendulum." I spent 20 minutes carefully teaching the physical principle that governs a swinging pendulum. The law of the pendulum is: A pendulum can never return to a point higher than the point from which it was released. Because of friction and gravity,

when the pendulum returns, it will fall short of its original release point. Each time it swings it makes less and less of an arc, until finally it is at rest. This point of rest is called the state of equilibrium, where all forces acting on the pendulum are equal.

I attached a 3-foot string to a child's toy top and secured it to the top of the blackboard with a thumbtack. I pulled the top to one side and made a mark on the blackboard where I let it go. Each time it swung back I made a new mark. It took less than a minute for the top to complete its swinging and come to rest. When I finished the demonstration, the markings on the blackboard proved my thesis.

I then asked how many people in the room BELIEVED the law of the pendulum was true. All of my classmates raised their hands, so did the teacher. He started to walk to the front of the room thinking the class was over. In reality it had just begun. Hanging from

the steel ceiling beams in the middle of the room was a large, crude but functional pendulum (250 pounds of metal weights tied to four strands of 500-pound test parachute cord.). I invited the instructor to climb up on a table and sit in a chair with the back of his head against a cement wall. Then I brought the 250 pounds of metal up to his nose. Holding the huge pendulum just a fraction of an inch from his face, I once again explained the law of the pendulum he had applauded only moments before, "If the law of the pendulum is true, then when I release this mass of metal, it will swing across the room and return short of the release point. Your nose will be in no danger."

After that final restatement of this law, I looked him in the eye and asked, "Sir, do you believe this law is true?" There was a long pause. Huge beads of sweat formed on his upper lip and then weakly he nodded and whispered, "Yes." I released the pendulum. It made a swishing sound as it arced across the room. At the far end of its swing, it paused momentarily and started back. I never saw a man move so fast in my life. He literally dived from the table. Deftly stepping around the still-swinging pendulum, I asked the class, "Does he believe in the law of the pendulum?" The students unanimously answered, "NO!"

True belief must be from the heart.

Answers to prayer.

Answers to prayer took place every day. An example of this was during our last day in Guatemala. There were several adults that were sick with stomach issues. Our doctor and team member, Erica, had only enough doses of an antibiotic that she had brought for one more adult. She counted the remaining pills left the night before and there was only one dose left. Then, in the morning, there were two adults that woke up with stomach issues. She came to one team member to give her the last dose and found that there was an additional dose. This is just one example of many how God provided.

No one left unchanged.

The whole team was changed. It may be the perspective we now have on life. It may be our view of missions and how we can be a part of the God's plan to reach others in countries like Guatemala. For others it may be a new perspective on how we can reach our neighbors and friends with the good news of God's salvation. No matter what the change is, we all know that our lives will be never be the same again.

Kids, kids, and more kids.

We could not help but share how many kids came to our VBS and how much their smiles and joy causes us to feel like we were making a difference. On average, we had around 100 kids come to the property where we were doing the VBS program. Many would walk from a long distance, some on the other side of a

mountain, to come to experience the program with us. Not only at the property, but we were also able to go to a public school while it was in session and share about God with them and the teachers. How cool is that! Another day we spent the morning up in a rural community sharing with the kids and mothers that came to check out what we were doing. A leader of the community was so happy we were coming that he offered for us to use his land to set up the VBS program. Another let us use his field for the game time. And the community asked us to come back again. What a blessing.

Salvation.

The ultimate goal was to see many come to Christ. When we gave the invitation in one area, one little boy was not sure he was being seen when he raised his hand to come to Christ so he stood on his chair on his tip toes just so he was not missed. During another invitation after a testimony by one of our team members, two women came forward to accept Christ. The eternal impact of our trip was evident during these times and other times when people came forward.

The mission of Bethel's children's ministries is to partner with families in helping children to become Christ-followers who grow, connect, serve, and tell. Bethel can only do this through volunteers. Volunteers are people--men, women, and youth who are part of the church body who are willing to use their gifts and give their time to be used by God in partnering with families.

Each week there are 26 volunteers needed to staff our children's programs. Some volunteers serve every week and some of them serve on a rotation (once every 5-6 weeks).
